Nursery to P3 Return



We are looking forward to seeing Nursery to Primary Three children returning to school next week. Obviously, this will be the first time that over 200 Children have been back at school and given that lockdowns are still operation, we want to ensure that this is done safely.

In advance of the school re-opening you should also discuss, explain and promote good respiratory hygiene to encourage your children to follow the 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' approach. Children should be discouraged from touching their eyes, face, nose and mouth. They should be shown how to cough or sneeze into their elbow if they don't have a tissue. If they have a tissue they should be shown how to cough or sneeze into it and then dispose of it safely into the nearest bin.

Once again, it is important that everyone does their part. For the first time in nearly a year, we can actually see light at the end of the tunnel but we are by no means out of the woods yet. Therefore, we wanted to remind parents of some of the protocols that we have in place for everyone's safety.

- A school bag is not permitted at this time to help prevent infection. All resources will be provided by the school i.e. pencil, colours etc...
- At break-time our usual healthy break policy still applies. Healthy Snacks provision
 that has operated in Nursery to P3 will continue and information about this has
 already been posted on Seesaw.
- A water bottle (clearly marked with your child's name) can be brought in to school and must be sanitised daily.
- Packed lunch should be brought in a disposable bag (clearly marked with the child's name) as no lunch boxes are permitted at this time. We would recommend using paper bags to help the environment.
- Free School Meals & paid dinners will continue to be served in classrooms.
- The school is now cashless so payments should be made through our School Money
 App
- All pupils will need to bring their own tissues.
- A coat should be worn into school by all children as the weather is still quite cold.
 When senior classes return, this coat will continue to be brought into the classroom and stored behind their chair.
- School uniform will be worn as normal (no school tie for hygiene reasons regular washing of school uniform at 60 degrees is essential for disease control.
- **PE Kits** <u>all</u> children will wear PE KIT to school, on their designated PE Days, until further notice. Teachers will notify you of the days when they intend to do PE and on these days.
- Homework will continue to be set through Seesaw and/or Google Classroom.

- Parents should not enter the school building unless for prior arranged reasons or under exceptional circumstances.
- Pickup/Drop Off at the designated times for your children (see below).

Drop Off/Pickup

Parent of Nursery to P4 children may still drop off and collect their children from the designated points below. However, all parents should wear face masks when dropping off or collecting their children, to help with viral transmission, as well as maintain a 2m distance with other families. Please do not congregate on premises or at school gates. In addition, we ask that only one parent per family do the pick-up/drop off, to avoid congestion. Parents of any child (P5-7) attending the Key Worker Supervision Scheme should drop them off and pick them up off school premises, at an agreed point along the Cliftonville Road. P5-7 children will be dismissed from the front of the main entrance.
