Holidays During Term Time

Increasingly, some parents are booking holidays outside of school vacation periods. Whilst the temptation to do so is there, it should be noted that this has a direct impact on the education of their Children. Parents should also note that such holidays require a letter to make the teacher aware of this absence. In most cases, unless the circumstances are exceptional, this absence will be unauthorised and will be marked on the attendance register as such.

Work in advance of or during holidays will not be provided for unauthorised absences.

Picking Children Up Early

We would like to remind parents that it is important that appointments are booked outside of school times, to avoid Children missing key learning. Increasingly, over the past couple of days, parents have arrived in the office lobby to pick Children up from school early for an appointment. In some instances, no note had been provided and therefore, both the teacher and the Child were unaware of this.



Of course, emergencies do happen and last-minute appointments are not always available from GP's. However, removing children from class on a regular basis will be both detrimental to their child and disruptive to the class and office staff.

Please ensure that all appointments, during school time, are kept to a minimum and that notes are provided in advance clearly stating the reason for the withdrawal.

In addition, parents are asked to complete the sign out sheet at the office.



Free School Meals Survey

The school receives extra money for every child registered for Free School Meals and this money helps to provide essential resources for classrooms. No Cycling on school property


We encourage our pupils to cycle or use scooters to come to school. However, please remember not to cycle or scoot on school grounds to avoid accidents.

Reminders

New Routines



The children have been settling into their new routines since Tuesday and should now know the door that they enter in the morning. From this week, with the exception of Primary One children, all other children should be entering the main playground gate on their own. Staff will be on hand to supervise and assist all Children arriving into their classrooms safely. This is not only good child protection practice, it also helps children become more independent and self-sufficient. Remember, gates will not open before 8.55am.

Dogs on school property

Please do not bring your dog onto school property – this is an Education Authority regulation.

Dogs, even on leads, cannot enter the playground or be inside the school gates or on the school paths. Even the cutest, gentle and most obedient dog can have a 'bad day' which could result in a child being scarred for life! Please work with the school to keep everyone safe.



Attendance

It is essential that our pupils attend school regularly and maintain a pattern of good attendance throughout their school career. Excellent attendance at school is important to allow a Child or young person to fulfil their potential. Please take time to read the Attendance Matters guide, included with this bulletin, to find out how you may support your child meeting their potential.



If your child is absent, for any reason, from school then please complete an absence slip or send in a note to explain their absence. A set of absence slips will be sent home with each child next week. As stated in the A to $\mathbb Z$ Guide to the Year Ahead, we will be looking at ways to improve attendance and ask that parents work constructively with the school on this.

<u>Punctuality</u>



All of us can and will be late on the odd occasion and if this is the case, please send your child into the office lobby if the gate to the playground is closed. However, whilst we recognise that we can all be late on a rare occasion, we also know that there are families that are persistently late. I would ask that if you believe that you are one of these families, that you

make the necessary adjustments to your routines to ensure that you leave ample time to arrive and pick up punctually. As stated in the A to C Guide to the Year Ahead, we will be looking at ways to improve punctuality and ask that parents work constructively with the school on this.

Respectful Behaviour

Please be respectful in how you interact with other parents when leaving their children at school. You are surrounded by children who should only witness respectful behaviour. The school reserves the right to exclude a person from school property if their behaviour is disrespectful of others.

School Bus

As you are aware, Cliftonville Integrated operates a school bus. The bus is a safe and costeffective way to get your child(ren) home from school. A note of the current route and stops is as follows:-



Bus stops:

Cliftonpark Avenue → Summer Street → Manor Street → Agnes Street → Shankill Road → Woodvale Road → Crumlin Road then onto part of Ballysillan Road and turning down onto the Oldpark Road

Please look at these and email into the school if you would use the bus if an additional stop was added. The cost of this bus is £1.05, paid directly to the bus driver by your child.

Parking on and around Cliftonville Road

Parents are reminded that Easton Avenue is a private road and only residents' vehicles are permitted to enter this street. Therefore, parents should park safely on Cliftonville Road and other side streets, ensuring that they are not blocking streets, parking on Chevrons or blocking visibility for those crossing the road. We know that parking outside the school is problematic and sympathise with all parents but unless we all work together on this, a child could get hurt or worse. Use the traffic lights and respect the markings!
