# <u>Punctuality</u>


This year, we have issued letters where persistent lateness is occurring and will continue to do so to ensure that the education of Children is not disrupted.

All of us can and will be late on the odd occasion and if this is the case, we do not issue letters. However, we do ask that where a child is late, the reason for this lateness is recorded when you bring them to the reception.

We also know that persistent lateness often occurs because of poor morning routines. If your Child(ren) is persistently late then you must address this immediately and ensure that they arrive to school before the gates close at 9pm. The school will continue to liaise with the Education Welfare Officer on this and will do everything that we can do to eradicate lateness as we all know that this disrupts the flow of teaching, makes the Child who is late anxious and has a long-term impact on the education of latecomers as they miss important teaching points.

#### Half Term

Don't forget that school will finish at 2pm for all pupils on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> February.





School will be closed from Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February, which is also Ash Wednesday, Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> and Friday 16<sup>th</sup> February. #### **Attendance**

It is essential that our pupils attend school regularly and maintain a pattern of good attendance throughout their school career. Excellent attendance at school is important to allow a Child or young person to fulfil their potential. Please take time to read the Attendance Matters guide, that has been re-issued with this bulletin.

Each month, we meet with the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) to discuss the individual attendance of our pupils. As a result of these meetings, we then issue letters to parents, hold meetings with parents and make referrals to the Education Welfare Service (EWS) where an EWO is assigned to that family. If poor attendance persists, the EWO will recommend further action which may include prosecution and in a magistrate's court, a parent could be fined up to £1,000 for each child who misses school. In some circumstances, the EWS may apply for Education Supervision Orders in the Family Proceedings Court. So, attendance is taken very seriously by both schools and the EWS.

We understand that Children get sick and know that some absenteeism from school is often unavoidable. However, we can also see patterns emerging where Children are off frequently for a day here and a day there and this happens on a regular basis. Whilst we do not want you to send your Children into school sick, we do ask parents to question whether the absence from school is necessary and think of the long-term impact that absence will have on academic potential. Even relatively good attendance of 95% across the seven years of primary school is the equivalent of 14 full weeks of school missed in primary school. Attendance of 80% across the seven years of primary school is equivalent to 1 year and 15 weeks of primary school missed. This is time that cannot be made up and education that will be lost which will mean potential is not reached.

<u>Please think Carefully the next time you are considering an absence.</u>

This week we held Safer Internet Day and I would like to thank all the staff for making sure this was a focused, informative and fun day for the children. Our pupils had the opportunity to engage in several interesting activities whilst thinking about how to stay safe on the internet. I would like to extend a special thanks to Mrs Holdsworth who co-ordinated throughout the school.

However, internet safety is not just about one day in the year but instead should be ongoing throughout the year both at home and more importantly, when your children are outside of school where we know many incidents can occur. We must all ensure that children remain safe at all times.
