Covid Update



Parents must continue to take all precautions to protect everyone within our school so please do not, under any circumstances, send a child to school where they display symptoms – cough, temperature and loss of smell or taste. If this is the case, it is essential that you inform the office so that they can ensure that the appropriate absence mark is recorded against your son/daughter's name.

A child with Covid symptoms should only return to school on receipt of a **negative PCR test** result, provided they are well enough and have not had a fever for 48 hours. If a test is not Carried out, the child should not return to school for 10 days. Parents should inform the school office if their child receives a **POSITIVE PCR TEST**.
