
Seesaw

Punctuality

Picking Children Up Early

Our Primary One to Three children finish at 2pm each day and our Primary Four to Seven children finish at 3pm each day apart from Wednesday when they all get out at 2pm. Please do not pick children up early unless they have an emergency appointment.
