Action Short of Strike

As stated in bulletins in October, three unions, GMB, Unison and NIPSA, which represents the vast majority of our non-teaching and canteen staff, are currently on Action Short of Strike. This included a proposed strike day on Thursday 16th November. As stated by text yesterday, this day of strike action has now been confirmed. Therefore, having assessed the risk, it is not possible to open the school to pupils that day on grounds of health & Safety, adequate supervisions during

breaks, provision of lunches and also on grounds of making the site secure.

Therefore, school will be closed to all pupils on Thursday 16th November 2023.

Our non-teaching education staff are essential and vital to the running of our schools. Indeed, our schools simply would not be able to function without them and this is illustrated through the decision to close. However, staff should be respected in their decision to strike. Strike action is very unusual and taking the step of strike action is not something that any member of the school staff takes lightly. Those on strike will have thought long and hard about their decision and will also lose pay for the period that they are on strike.

Teachers have been instructed to provide work on this day and individual year groups will deliver this either through Seesaw or as a hardcopy, depending on what they feel is the most suitable and appropriate way to complete it. Please ensure all work is returned to the class teacher via Seesaw (if delivered on Seesaw) or directly to the teacher, if work was provided by hard copy.

All the staff, teaching and non-teaching, are invaluable to the learning, development and safeguarding of your children and I, along with the Board of Governors, feel strongly that they should be paid fairly for the essential and very challenging jobs that they do. A job that is done with enthusiasm, diligence and vigour. However, I do also recognise that strikes have an impact on children and parents and for this I am sorry for the inconvenience.

Taking Photographs

This creates a child protection issue for the school as you may not have permission to take a photograph of another parent's child. The simplest and easiest way to avoid this is to ensure that other children are not in the frame of the photo and if they are, crop it or delete it. Thank you for your co-operation on this.



Morning Gate

The gate at the front playground will close at 9am each morning. Please ensure that your Children arrive punctually so that they may go into school with their friends. However, if a child does arrive at school after the gate is shut at 9am, they must now use the main entrance to the school. Parents are reminded that all lateness should be explained to the school through a note or by completing the book at the front office. Unfortunately, office staff may not be in a position to walk children to their room, and

this should be explained to your Child before they arrive at school late, as well as the door that they need to use. Pupils who are late should walk independently to their own classrooms. The school continues to monitor punctuality and where frequent lateness is identified, the school will liaise with both the parent and Education Welfare Service to try and ensure that this is addressed for the benefit of the education of the child.
