Reminders

Approaching Children/Other Parents

From time to time, Children fall out or incidents can occur. We encourage all our Children to speak directly to a member of staff when this happens in order to resolve the issue. As a school we will always attempt to resolve school-based incidents to the satisfaction of all concerned. With this in mind, I would like to remind parents and carers that they should not approach any Child / parent directly as a result of an alleged incident that occurred in school. We would ask that parents speak directly to the class teacher or another staff member.

Easton Avenue

I would like to thank all those parents who have used Easton Avenue with consideration for both our neighbours and the other parents when they have been dropping off and picking Children up. We would ask all parents to be vigilant and if you see a member of our school community parking or driving in these areas, report it to the school, including vehicle registration numbers.



Despite numerous appeals, some parents continue to ignore our pleas and selfishly park or drive into this street. This is not only a breach of the law around parking on a private road but more importantly, a danger to the parents and Children who are walking their Children to and from our school. We will continue to liaise with the residents and the PSNI to resolve this issue.

In the meantime, this will be monitored over the next week and if the situation does not improve, Easton Avenue will be shut until further notice. This will unfortunately impact on all parents, including those who have been observing the rules and respecting our neighbours. Parents should have also received a text message about this so please pass this information onto anyone collecting your children.
